From this source, I can infer that Singapore is facing a difficult decision between racial and religious cooperation or conflict. This is because the source shows a man, representing Singapore and its general population, trying to choose between the Fukuyama thesis, representing racial and religious cooperation; and the Huntington thesis, representing such conflict, as the country is still reluctant to fully develop in the direction of peace and democracy. In addition, I can also infer that Singapore is not yet a nation as it has yet to find its identity, hence the word "doubt" emphasised in the words "Little Red Doubt" in the background, a pun on one of Singapore's titles, the "little red dot".

The source was found on the Ministry of Education National Education website in 2007, and thus would have been meant for students and future leaders of Singapore. The intended message is probably that Singapore should emphasise religious and cultural cooperation as opposed to conflict. The purpose is to inculcate in our future leaders the importance of racial and religious harmony, so that they can make Singapore a truly ethnically-diverse and harmonious, genuine nation in the future.
